Quiotee's Lair 2007 Pinot Noir

Vineyards: White Rose Vineyard (48.5%), Vista Hills Vineyard- Block E (33.5%), Durant Vineyard- Bishop Block (18%)

Harvest: October 13, 2006

Cooperage: 100% French Oak (15% new- Damy and Billon). Aged in barrel for 14 months.

Bottled: January 2, 2009

pH: 3.48

Alcohol: 13.0%

Production: 812 cases

This is our flagship wine each vintage and represents the elegance, weight, complexity and fruit character we look for in our wines. We achieved our stylistic goal for Quiotee's Lair 2007 by blending barrels from our top three vineyard sites, all located in the heart of the Dundee Hills AVA. All three sites sit on elevated, east-southeast facing slopes that range from 600-900 ft elevation. All three vineyards are planted on volcanic Jory soils and yield 1.5-1.75 tons/acre.

Winemaker Notes:

"The wine is complex and rich. Fruit, spice, earth and floral notes on the nose, and full of blackberry, cherry, raspberry, anise, and sweet leather on the palate. Showing concentration, layers of flavors, bright acidity and tight tannin structure on the palate, this wine has very good aging potential." – Jesus Guillen, Winemaker

"A highly expressive nose of floral, ripe red berry and a talcum powder element gives way to a round, supple and relatively forward light to medium-bodied flavors that possess fine intensity and precision on the solidly complex finish that displays real verve and persistence. This is still a bit youthfully austere and awkward though it should come together with a year or two in bottle and last for most of another."

"Bright red. Fresh strawberry and redcurrant aromas, with energetic notes of mineral and fresh flowers. Strikingly elegant and supple, with sappy red fruit flavors lifted by a bright mineral kick on the finish. The

“Quiotee’s Lair is named for one of winemaker Greg Sander’s children. A special selection from the estate vineyard, planted in 1980, it is a low-yield (one ton per acre), own-rooted, Pommard clone pinot of exceptional power. Oaky, leathery, earthy flavors with a potent resinous scent recall a certain illicit weed. Finally, the wine slides into a finish loaded with chocolate, coffee and butterscotch.
